Joined by Philadelphia Conference Lay Organization (PCLO) host President, Kevin D. Lamb (also newly elected), they delivered two power-packed days of workshops and worship, emphasizing the theme “Next Level Laity: Embrace, Encourage, and Empower”. - “Encourage Laity Participation: We Are the Total Church”, Moderated by Sister Susan Butler (Campbell AME Church, Frankford, PA; First Episcopal District Director of the YPD). Demonstrating the varied music and worship styles across the generations down through the years, Sister Butler highlighted the different characteristics of generations and how we can connect more



effectively. Attendees enjoyed a lively, engaging dialogue among the panelists Brother Terrill Carney (Jones Tabernacle AME Church, Philadelphia, PA Local Lay President), Sister Marie L. Butler (Campbell AME Church, Frankford, PA; Marshal - FEDLO), and Sister Sis. Aaronica Burrell (Philadelphia Conference).

- “Encourage Laity and Clergy To Work Together: A Unified Body”, presenter Reverend Alberta Jones, Pastor of Bethel AME Church, Reading, Pennsylvania,

emphasized inclusion as a major key to empowering laity and leadership for growth and service.

- “Empower Next Level Laity: Where Do We Go From Here?”, presented by Sister Starsha Frierson who is the Philadelphia Conference Young Adult Representative and a member of Grimes AME Church, Phoenixville, PA. Sister Frierson taught us that in order to go to the next level, we need to: be self-aware and accountable, manage personal bias, be



careful of micro-aggression, recognize that each person is of value.

To top off the phenomenal workshops, Bishop Samuel L. Green, Sr., Presiding Prelate of the First Episcopal District joined the attendees for a “Conversation with the Bishop” 60-minute session. Attendees raised various questions regarding components meeting during the bishop’s meetings, including parliamentary procedures during the General Conference, the future of the First Episcopal District Headquarters, being heard as young adults, and being included in Connectional AME Church organizations. Bishop Green was open, candid, and gracious in addressing all questions.

Our souls were spiritually fed in the Friday evening worship as Bishop Green taught the packed Delta Hotel ballroom with the powerful, thought-provoking, soul-searching sermon “But I Never Stopped Praying”, taken from Samuel’s story in Judges 16:27-28. We must not be people of a “seasoned faith”.
